

# Scotland and Climate Change -

## Getting it Right

**Donald A. Brown** is Associate Professor of Environmental Ethics, Science and Law at Penn State University where he is currently teaching interdisciplinary courses on climate change and sustainable development and acting as Program Director of the Collaborative Program on the Ethical Dimensions of Climate Change. Before holding this position he was an environmental lawyer for the states of Pennsylvania and New Jersey and Program Manager for United Nations Organizations at the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Office of International Environmental Policy. In this position he represented the United States Environmental Protection Agency on United States delegations to the United Nations negotiating climate change, biodiversity, and sustainable development issues. Mr Brown has written about and lectured extensively on climate change issues over the last 20 years. He has lectured on climate change issues at 30 universities in eight countries. His interest has been the need to integrate environmental science, economic, and law in environmental policy making. His latest book is *American Heat, Ethical Problems with the US Response to Global Warming*.
