Paul McAleavey is a European Union civil servant who comes originally from Clackmannanshire in Scotland. After completing his doctorate in Social and Political Sciences at the European University Institute in Florence in 1995, he joined the European Commission in Brussels. After five years as a policy officer there and a further five years as political advisor to the European Commissioner for the Environment, Paul McAleavey was seconded to the European Environment Agency (EEA) in Copenhagen. He currently remains on secondment from the European Commission to the Agency where he is responsible for the political communications department.



The EEA reports to the European institutions, member states and the public on the state of Europe's environment. The Agency also prepares the annual report to the UNFCCC on behalf of the European Community on member states' progress in reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
